The Personal Entrepreneur

Career Entrepreneur: takes responsibility to invest in own human capital for a lifetime return.

Intrapreneur: employee acting entrepreneurially, solving customer problems and introducing new solutions.

The Nascent Entrepreneur

Embryonic Entrepreneur: pre-revenue: the phase of customer discovery. \checkmark

Emerging Entrepreneur: post-revenue, pre-profit; searching for sustainable business model. \checkmark

The Lifestyle Entrepreneur

Craft Entrepreneur: capitalizing and monetizing a special skill, talent or expertise.

Virtual Entrepreneur: utilizing digital interconnectivity to build supply chain and infrastructure to support an \checkmark online business.

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The Employer Entrepreneur

Family Business Owner: leveraging built-in trust and loyalty of family as employees. \checkmark

Small Business Owner: employees support growth, require hiring and management skills.

The Growth Entrepreneur

Expansionary: escaping confines of small business with product line, location and customer base expansion.

Gazelle: take VC funding to turbocharge growth.

Super Entrepreneurs

Mavericks: Win with consistently contrarian thinking and action. \checkmark

Heroes: Create personal PR and leverage it for funding and fame.
